Students in Grades 1-6 took the New Group Reading Test (NGRT) this week. Students in Grade 1 do this with a teacher on paper while students in Grades 2-6 completed theirs online in the socially-distanced MIS ICT Suite. This test is a dynamic test in that it challenges students beyond their reading level at times then finds the 'just right' reading level for the student.

We will then gather that information and it is used to better inform teachers when they are designing leveled reading groups. These reports are designed for teachers, so while the NGRT does not give us a written report for parents, they allows us to be able to better differentiate for individual students not only in reading but in other subjects where reading is a key aspect of learning.

The children always try their very best and take these assessments seriously. I want to say thank you to the students as well as to Mr. Hall for arranging the NGRT sittings as well as Mr. Mills, Mr. Burton, and Ms. Harrison for managing the actual administration of the tests.

Additionally, I met with our Curriculum Team Leaders for English, Maths, Humanities, Arts and Science in order to pre-plan with them ahead of next Monday's upcoming meetings with their teams to plan out re-configured events for the remainder of the year. The purpose of this pre-planning meeting was to make them aware of the parameters and protocols outlined by Chiba Prefecture in order to prevent the risk of COVID-19. I know that students and parents alike are eager to find out what events we might be holding and what they will look and feel like. We ask for your patience as we plan these out, providing fun opportunities for our students while maintaining the safety and well-being of the entire MIS community. Following the parameters from Chiba Prefecture and in alignment with our MIS Return to School Operation Protocols, we will not be able to have parents on campus as spectators at events but will look at videoing events and securely broadcasting them to parents after the event.

I can tell you that contrary to the original 2020-2021 MIS School Calendar, we will <u>**not**</u> be holding Sports Day on Saturday, September 26th but will hold it on a weekday at a date to be announced later.

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G2 Are Acting and Student-Teaching


