We are excited to announce that during the week of November 24-27 - in collaboration with the MIS PTA - MIS will be holding a Road Safety Week. The idea is to raise student awareness of what they can do to be safe as walkers, bike riders, and in cars or buses.

During this week, the MIS PTA will be patrolling nearby intersections while teachers will be introducing presentations, videos and activities to teach and/or remind student of how to be safe on the road and sidewalk at all times day and night. Additionally, we plan to revive the Helmet House Point campaign where all students who wear their helmet on their bike to and from school, receive a special Helmet House Point. As has been tradition, this will be led as a Grade 3 Global Citizenship initiative.

The Chiba Nishi Police Department has also volunteered to teach our Grade 3 students how to be safe on their bikes with a Bike & Road Safety Program on Thursday, November 26th. Grade 3 parents received a letter two weeks ago and should have already replied back to Mr. Citrano if their child will be bringing in their bike on that day.



In addition, MIS has applied to Chiba City requesting that they install School Zone signs as well as stop lights or flashing yellow lights at the intersection between Aeon Style and Bay Park as these crossings are of particular concern to us. We hope that this multi-faceted approach, will help to ensure the safety of our school community on the roads and sidewalks surrounding us, and beyond!



Is it Alkaline?

This week, our Grade 6 students, as part of their work in Chemistry, have been using litmus paper to test whether liquids are acids or bases (or neutral). Mr. Smithers had set out many types of liquids for the students to test from juices to teas to acids, soaps and bleaches. The students were amazed at the different colors that the various liquids produced on the litmus paper and used a color chart in their Science Journals to identify how basic or acidic the different liquids were.


