Greetings from MIS. In this week's edition of Nanohana, I would like to highlight some of the wonderful Global Citizenship projects that came to fruition at the end of the last school year.

Throughout the year, we had a number of cheerful spirit days that brought plenty of colour, laughter and life to MIS. As you likely know, each time we have a spirit day, we ask that you contribute at least 100 yen to the Red Feather Campaign. I am pleased to announce that during the course of the year, we managed to raise 129,690 yen for this wonderful cause. We look forward to more spirit days and

more opportunities to raise funds to help others.

As a part of their Global Citizenship Award, G6 led a project to collect clothes and fabrics from MIS families for the Japan Fabric Solidarity Association (JFSA). For three weeks, you kindly sent in your donations and the G6 students collected these from the classrooms, sorted them into similar garment types, and then presented the collection to Mr. Ichikawa from the JFSA in the final week of term. You donated so much to the cause that his van was completely full and he had to make a second trip for the final bags of clothes. Overall, G6 collected 482.1kg of clothes for the JFSA and Mr. Ichikawa wanted to share he gratitude to the MIS community for their generosity. The donations will now be sold in Japan or shipped to Pakistan for use to support the schools that the JFSA partner with.

I would like to thank you all for supporting our Global Citizenship work because it really makes a difference in the lives of others in Japan and in the wider world. Our Global Citizenship projects begin again this week and we are always keen to broaden the scope of our efforts.
