The weekly assemblies at MIS are a great opportunity for the Kindergarten and Elementary sections of the school to share wonderful experiences, news, music and celebrations. This year, we are producing video assemblies and these are watched in class.

Each week, Mr Citrano's assemblies focus on ethical concepts and delivers these messages in a way that can be appreciated and understood by all students. These assemblies often include food for thought as well as interesting pictures, music and

video clips that help to explain the ethical theme. The Kindergarten assemblies have given the children a chance to introduce themselves and have helped the children to learn about each other.

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Grade 4 Develop and Teach Their Own Games



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






MIS PTA hosts the 1st Online Café for all MIS families.

Yes, you can join and ask questions anonymously, if you would like. With Zoom, you can change your display name and there is an option to ask question by Chat anonymously.
