Developing A Strong Community of Friendships

Having one friend is great but what if that friend has to stay at home because they are feeling sick? The more friends we make, the more we practice the skill of connecting with others. Sometimes we hear children saying 'My friends don't want to play with me.' or observe a child standing on the outskirts of a group of children playing. Approaching other children who are playing takes bravery and practice.

In addition to being brave, the child also needs the language required to ask if they can play too. This week, we focused on asking others 'Can I play?'. Just like when we ask for a drink of water when we are thirsty, this question becomes less scary and more natural the more we practice it. This week staff around kindergarten have encouraged children to make new friends and use this language to initiate play with friends that they don't usually play with. This is also a skill that children can develop at home with siblings or when playing with friends outside of school. When you hear your child being brave and asking others to play, or inviting a friend who is on their own to join their game remember to praise them for being a good friend.

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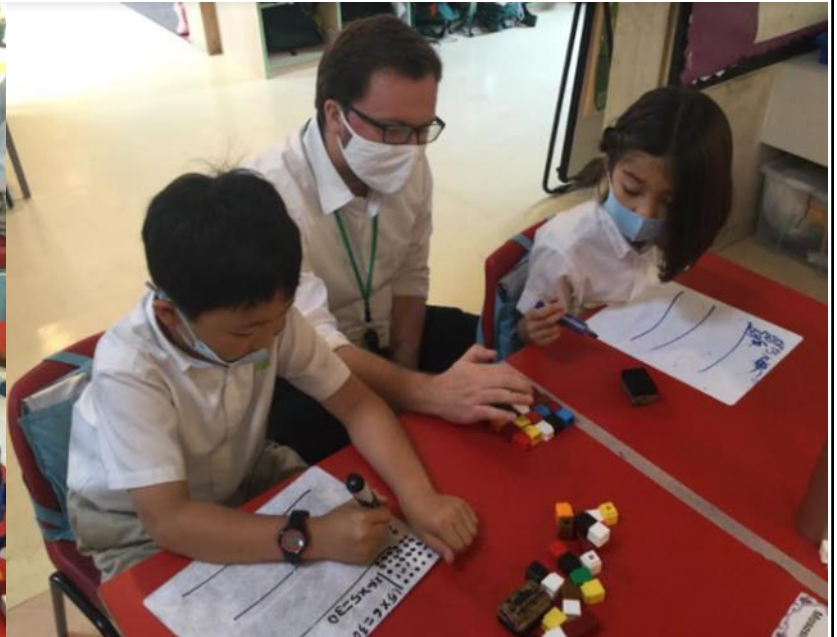
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Grade 2 Use Arrays to Discover Different Ways to Multiply

G2 have started their studies on multiplication by making arrays. The students represented multiplication in columns and rows. They showed how looking at the array from different angles allows you to generate different multiplication equations, for example, $4 \times 5 = 20$ and $5 \times 4 = 20$.

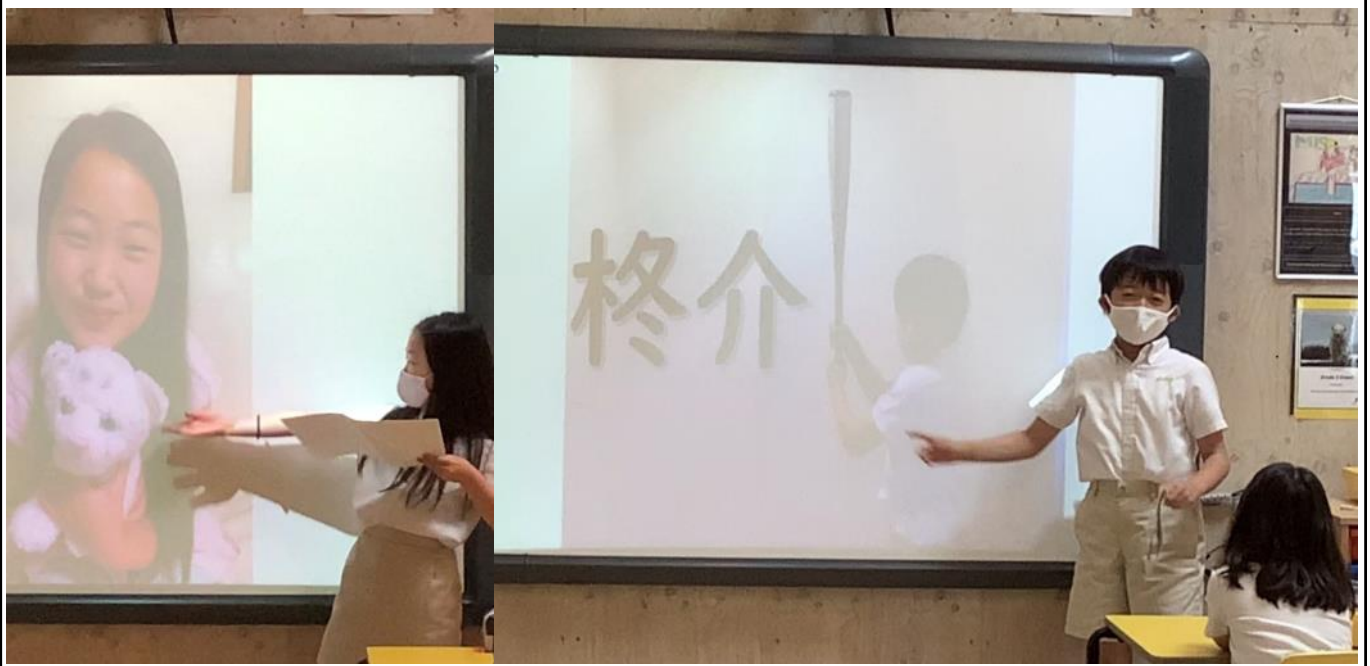
Grade 4 Save the Environment While Watering Their Flowers!

Grade 4 looked at how they could reuse plastic items in their Social Studies unit on Waste. They painted recycled bottles and turned them into watering cans. Through trial and error, they students created an efficient way to water their flowers while reusing plastic for another purpose.
