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Candy Cane Science in Grade 4!



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Grade 1 Really Come Together and Get in Shape!

Students are thinking about shapes this week, and used their whole bodies to make the sides of each shape. Count the sides (edges) and corners (vertices) of each polygon! Can you see which one is a triangle (3 sides), square (4 sides), pentagon (5 sides), hexagon (6 sides), heptagon (7 sides), octagon (8 sides), nonagon (9 sides), and decagon (10 sides)? Did you know that the word "polygon" means "many (poly) angles (gon)"?
