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Grade 3 Practice Bike Safety and Map their Community!



Students road their bicycles through intersections controlled by electronic traffic signals. Additionally, as part of their work on maps and symbols for Social Studies, G3Y went on a trip around the local area to learn and understand more about facilities and services in our area. They needed to add their own symbols and a key to a map that they had drawn themselves while navigating around the local area.
