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Grade 1 Learn Road Safety with Real-Life Experiences!

This term in PSNS, Grade 1 students have been learning about the importance of road safety. To help with this they took a trip to the Makuhari Road Safety Park. This was a great opportunity to put what they have been learning in class into real practice on the road. Grade 2 Develop their Passing, Catching & Dribbling Skills!

In G2 PE, the students have been learning overhand, underhand and chest passing, focusing on accuracy and distance. They have also practiced their catching skills and dribbling skills using different-sized balls in a variety of activities.



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Grade 3 Explore the Dynamics of Flying with the Wind!

In Science as part of their investigations on wind and its uses, the Grade 3 made and tested a kite. They experimented with different designs to learn more about the dynamics of wind.



Grade 4 Use Clay & Stop Motion to Bring 3D Models to Life!

Grade 4 have been creating 3D art using modeling clay. They've used stop motion to animate the models and voice acting to bring a story to life. The students are exhibiting amazing creativity while developing new transferable skills!



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Grade 5 Experiment with Plant Growth!

With summer in full swing, the G5 students worked together to plant vegetables and fruits. They have each created their own experiments to see which is the best way to grow tasty vegetables.



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Grade 6 Angle Up their Learning!

The Grade 6 students have been practicing how to use a protractor to draw and measure different types of angles – acute, obtuse, and reflex angles. This is leading into the next unit on 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. Everyone is doing well – it's harder than it looks!



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Elementary Students Excel in Japanese!

The students in G3-6 celebrated Calligraphy Week from June 12-16 practicing careful strokes and creating beautiful shuji. While the students in Grade 2 took a 'Creature Quiz' based on the interesting information they read in their illustrated books. The students presented their findings to their class. Grade 2 also closely observed and journaled about the chrysanthemums growing in the garden - working hard to create accurate and beautiful sketches.
