

Grade 4 Design and Build Their Own 'Skeletons'

G4G have been learning about the important functions of the human skeleton. Did you know that the human skeleton has 206 bones? The students have been finding how those bones support our most important body part – our brain! To do this, they were challenged to create a structure that would support a heavier object on top. They made some interesting skeletal structures.






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Grade 5 Create Art with Pendulums

In G5 the students have been studying pendulums. Here they are investigating using pendulums as a way of creating artwork. The young scientists experimented changing the length of strings, weight of the pendulums, and height they were hung from. It was great fun and very messy!



Grade 6 Create Brilliant Water Colour Paintings

This month G6G have been working with water colours in art. Students have gained or developed skills such as observational drawing, mixing colours, brush stroke technique, and copying. G6G students completed three different paintings, the first being a class example, the second being student choice, and the third being a combination of water colour painting and a one point perspective drawing.



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Celebrating Students Artistic Writing During Calligraphy Week

The New Year started with Calligraphy Week. Children demonstrated their Japanese artistic writing skills for the first time so far this year. The students painted the following characters G3 正月 New Year, G4美しい空 Beautiful sky, G5新しい風 New wind, G6夢の実現Dreams come true. The fourth to sixth graders used long pieces of paper and painted their letters carefully. Students in Grades 1 & 2 wrote theirs very carefully in pencil. The winners in each grade level were recognized in a recent assembly!
