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First Days of School!



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Grade 1 Roll, Move and Balance!

In PE this term, G1's focus is movement using different body actions and parts. In their gymnastic lessons they have been focusing on different rolls and starting to do movements in which they need to use control and balance.





Grade 2 Gardeners Tend the MIS Eco-Farm!

This week, G2 began work on the school garden. First, they dug over the soil and removed all the weeds. Then, they planted sunflower, lavender, cosmos and morning glory seeds along with tomato, pepper, aubergine, passionfruit, marigold and strawberry plants.



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Grade 3 Explore and Map our School

For Social Studies, Grade 3 have been learning how to navigate and understand map symbols. They went on a tour of the school and created their own maps of MIS with keys.



Grade 4 Go Back in Time

In G4, students have been learning about life in the past. They travelled back to a Victorian England classroom. It was very strange to write using chalk and to only 'speak when spoken to'. The children had three lessons during their time in the past; drill, arithmetic and dictation. The teachers were very strict but the experience was a valuable one and children have a better understanding of the difference between life then and now.




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Grade 5 Create Water Filters

Students in G5 have been learning about how ground water and surface water can become polluted due to different pollutants in the world. In Science class, we created our own water filters using the scientific method. Students learned through this experiment how difficult it is to create clean drinking water.



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Grade 6 Scientists Explore Combustion

In science lessons over the past few weeks, G6Y students have been learning about combustion and some of the chemical reactions caused when something burns. In their lesson this week, the students tested for an increase in the level of CO2 gas after a candle is extinguished. Students used 'limewater' or Calcium Hydroxide solution which turned milky white to show the presence of a high level of CO2. An interesting experiment conducted responsibly and safely by all. Well done!




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Grade 1 Students Introduce Themselves in Japanese
