Greetings from MIS. In this month's edition of Nanohana, I would like to give you updates about the way we encourage student voice at MIS. We firmly believe that MIS students should be empowered to share their thoughts about how the school can be improved to meet their personal development and learning needs. The Student Council is one way in which we seek feedback from students. The councilors are asked to survey their class regularly, be it about the Spirit Day events or how we can improve reading provision or homework at school. Students can share their requests with councilors at any time and these are discussed at our regular meetings. Our House Captains also have the responsibility to listen to

their teammates and pass on any thoughts about how to make our house team events better for all. The Global Citizenship projects are another way in which our students can share their thoughts for school improvement or other exciting ideas to help their community. On many occasions, projects have been started because students suggested them. For instance, the G5 rice paddy project came about because of a G3 student's desire to grow rice at MIS and the helmet house points were created by concerned G3 students. Additionally, we like to get the students' input about other special aspects of their school experience. For example, did you know that our school mascot Nano was designed by a MIS student?

Another opportunity for students to have their say came with last summer's holiday homework. In addition to the ever popular, design a house point challenge, the students were given the chance to become sportwear designers by creating a football kit design for the MIS Dragons Football Team. The various entries were displayed last week and the MIS Dragon team members voted on the design they would most like to wear. The winning design can be seen on this page. 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Grade 1 Artists Create Stained Glass

In Art, Grade 1 have been making 'stained glass' windows. The students first traced their initial letter using white pencils. They then created and cut out their windows. The final step was to choose colored cellophane and stick it over the window. This then created the stained-glass effect.



Grade 2 Create Healthy Lunches

On Friday 5th July, G2 held their annual Obento Day. As part of our healthy eating PSNS unit, we made a healthy lunch together. Our parent helpers worked with the children to prepare the food, which included tomatoes, aubergines and green peppers grown in our G2 garden! All parents were invited to join us for a picnic lunch and the children had a great time eating with their families.





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Grade 3 Explore the Power of Wind

Grade 3 have been looking at wind and how we measure wind speed. The students made their own anemometers and used these to measure different wind speeds.



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Grade 4 Practice Mixing Different Tones and Temperatures

Accompanying their research on the life cycles of different insects, Grade 4 created clay models of each stage. To achieve this, during art class, students first practiced making simple 3D shapes out of clay. They then looked at each insect and made rough sketches of the simple shapes each were made of. With this knowledge, the Grade 4s constructed and connected different shapes to make models for the full insect cycles, from eggs to larva to adults!



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Grade 5 Connect with New Scottish Pen Pals

This week, the G5 students received letters from a school in Scotland. Our students discovered interesting insights about their daily school routines and the unique personalities of their Scottish peers. In response, G5 crafted delightful letters sharing insights about themselves and our school, MIS!



Grade 6 Go on a Group Weekend Bike Ride

On Sunday, June 30th the Gós went on a bike ride along the Hanamigawa River. The students rode about 10 kms up the river to a big park where they had a picnic and played some games. 21 students and 4 parents participated which was terrific! The weather was perfect – cloudy with a lovely breeze the whole way. Thanks to everyone for joining. Let's do it again in Term 2!





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Grade 6 Make Their Own Pillow Book

In Grade 6 Kokugo, a guest teacher was invited to teach the students all about ancient earthenware. By actually holding them, the students were able to feel the differences in weight and patterns.

As part of their studies in Japanese, the first graders harvested the turnips they had grown since May! They were so responsible in watering and taking care of their plants each and every day.
