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Grade 1 Study the World with Traditional Tales

In Grade 1, students have been looking at traditional tales from various countries around the world. 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Grade 3 Make their own Sundials to Observe the Movement of the Sun

Grade 3 students made the most of a beautiful sunny day by constructing sundials to track the movement of shadows over time. This hands-on activity gave them the opportunity to observe the sun's changing position throughout the day and its impact on the length and angle of shadows. In addition, they learned how to use a compass to ensure they collected good data. The students were enthusiastic and engaged, eager to discuss what we could infer from the changes we recorded throughout the day.



For Grade 4 Science is Electric!

In Grade 4, students recently explored the fascinating world of circuits, learning how electricity powers everyday devices. They discovered the key differences between series and parallel circuits. In a series circuit, all components are connected along one path, so if one part stopped working, the entire circuit would fail. In contrast, parallel circuits allowed electricity to flow through multiple paths, meaning the rest of the circuit could still function even if one part was disrupted. This lesson highlighted how parallel circuits are often more practical for reliable systems, like home wiring.



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Grade 5 Collaborate with Grade 1 to Create Sewn Toys

Grade 5 and Grade 1 are currently working together to design and make sewn toys. Grade 1 designed some amazing toy creations that will be made by Grade 5. Grade 5 visited the Grade 1 classes earlier in the month to look at their designs and start planning how to make them. Everyone is very excited about this awesome collaboration!



Grade 6 Cook Up a Storm

The G6G class has begun their Home Economics cooking journey with delicious dishes like fruit salad, carbonara, and French toast. Working as a team, they have collaborated to prepare, cook, serve, and clean up - showcasing teamwork and culinary skills in the kitchen!
