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Innovative Bilingual Education for an Ever-Changing World

From Mr. Anthony Hall, Deputy Head of School



Greetings from MIS. At MIS, we are always looking for ways to better support our students' learning. This year, we are introducing a new type of assessment called MAP Growth for students from K3 to Grade 6.

MAP Growth is a computer-based test that helps us understand what each child knows and what they are ready to learn next in maths and the English language. It was first developed over 40 years ago by an organization called NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association) and is now used in schools around the world.

Students will take the MAP Growth test three times a year - in April, October, and January. After the October testing window, parents will receive a report showing their child's achievement and growth in learning. Teachers will use the test results to identify each student's learning needs and to set goals for their progress. This helps us provide more targeted support in the classroom.

During Term 2 we will hold a Parent Coffee Morning to share more about how MAP Growth works and how to understand the reports. The date and time for this session will be confirmed in the near future. If you have any questions in the meantime, please feel free to contact your child's teacher.

The MIS Bazaar is only a few weeks away. We cannot wait to welcome families and members of the local community to the exciting event. The day promises to be a celebration of life with fun stalls, awesome performances and delicious food on offer. We hope you can join us. Tickets for the class stalls will go on sale from the 12th of May. I will sell them at dismissal time from 3:20 until 3:35. The tickets are 100 Yen each and can be used to play the stall games, or purchase goods from the flea market. There are no refunds for unused tickets, so please use them all up on the day of the bazaar. Let's have a great time together.

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Grade 1 Use Their Imagination in their Reading and Writing!

In English, Grade 1 have been reading various short fiction stories and completing work based on the story. Recently, the students were read a story called 'Carrot Club' in which the carrots made an exclusive Carrot Only Club. By the end of the story the carrots learned that this was unfair, and created a more inclusive Veggie Club. The students then got to work together to think of ideas to continue the story. After writing the beginning of the story together as a class, the students were able to use their imagination to finish writing the story on their own.





Grade 2 Connect Gymnastics and Geometry!

In Grade 2, students kicked off their PE lessons by diving into the world of shapes. Students have been exploring a variety of body and gymnastic shapes, learning how to link them into short, expressive sequences. Through balance work and experimenting with different ways of travelling across a mat, they are developing their coordination, control, and confidence. From still shapes to dynamic movements, it's been inspiring to see their creativity and progress come to life.

Let it Grow, Grade 3!


As part of their science unit on life cycles, Grade 3 students have been busy planting and caring for mini sunflowers. With watering cans in hand and rulers at the ready, students have been enthusiastically tracking their plants' growth and learning first-hand about the stages of a plant's life.



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Grade 4 Bring Everyday Objects to Life!

In Grade 4 Art, the students have been exploring how to make their still life paintings more realistic by using tone and temperature. Tone helps us show light and shadow—making objects look 3D—while temperature (warm and cool colours) helps us create depth and mood. By carefully observing the objects in front of them, and thinking like real artists, the students are learning to paint compositions that pop off the page!





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Grade 5 Create Water Filters

Grade 5 students designed and built their own water filters as part of a hands-on science project. They tested their creations with great enthusiasm and were thrilled to see their designs successfully purify water!



Grade 6 Scientists Explore Combustion

This week the G6Y students were learning about combustion and the types of gases needed and created when there is fire. Students conducted an experiment using special tubes to measure oxygen and carbon dioxide levels before and after a fire occurs. All the students worked well together and were very safety conscious. A great lesson!
