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Innovative Bilingual Education for an Ever-Changing World



### From Mr. Anthony Hall, Deputy Head of School



Greetings from MIS. This week, I have the pleasure of celebrating a shining example of the academic success of our students. In February 2025, students from Grades 3 to 5 participated in the International Schools' Assessment (ISA), a programme developed by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) and designed specifically for international schools. The test provides MIS with a means to compare the academic performance of our students with other international school students. What follows are facts about the test:

Over 35,000 students took the tests at 142 international schools in 46 countries.

4,789 students took the Grade 3 test; 4,808 took the G4 test; 5,887 took the G5 test.

For purposes of making comparisons, schools are grouped according to their majority home language. MIS was listed as a Group 1 school. Group 1 schools have between 0% and 15% of their pupils whose native language at home is English.

When looking at the overall results, the MIS school community can be greatly reassured that our students' achievements compare very well to all other groups. In all subjects, MIS averages are above the averages for other Group 1 schools, Asian pacific schools' averages and the All Schools' averages. You can see these results in the chart below. Well done to the students, their teachers, and their parents—you deserve great credit! Should you need any further information about

#### Grade 1 Enjoy New Sections of the Library

This Term, Grade 1 have been enjoying their trips to the library. Mr. Hall has been slowly introducing the children to new areas of the library and allowing them to borrow books. Recently, the children have been shown the science section and allowed to borrow books from there!





#### Grade 2 Explore the Chiba Flower Museum

Grade 2 students recently enjoyed an exciting trip to the Chiba Flower Museum. They explored a variety of flowers and their parts, discussed the unique shapes of leaves and their purposes, and observed pollinators in action. To top off the day, some lucky students even discovered a playground to enjoy at the end of their visit!





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#### G3 Create Beautiful Artwork of Nature Around Them

For Art, the students in Grade 3 did close-up sketches of plants in our garden area. Then they created an imaginative watercolor painting combining the different images they had sketched using water colour techniques they have been learning about in Art class. As another connection, they have been learning about the life cycle of plants in Science recently.



#### Grade 4 Collaborate to Explore Changes Throughout the Seasons

In Grade 4 Science, students have been exploring the changes that living things experience during the different seasons throughout the year. For example, some animals change colours to better camouflage with their environment while some plants go into dormancy during winter to use less energy. Students worked in groups to research and put this information into posters, summarizing what they learned.



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#### Grade 5 Go Back in History and Enjoy Nature

Grade 5 went on their first excursion of the year to Sawara. The students were lucky enough to go on a beautiful boat ride down the Ono River and explore the historic district around the river. We then drove to Ayame Botanic Garden for a peaceful lunch and flower sketching. It was a wonderful day and everyone had a great time!



## **Grade 6 Explore the Tidal Creatures While Clamming**

Grade 6 recently enjoyed a fun and educational field trip clam digging. Students worked together to collect an impressive number of clams while enjoying time with their friends along the shore. As part of the experience, they also learned about clam anatomy, gaining a better understanding of these fascinating sea creatures. It was a memorable day full of discovery, teamwork, and muddy hands!



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## Grade 1 Grow Turnips to Study Plant Growth

As part of a cross-curricular project combining PSNS and Kokugo, the Grade 1 students planted turnip seeds. Each child filled their own pot with soil and planted the seeds. Now, tiny sprouts have started to appear, and the students are watering them every morning. We can't wait to see them grow big and strong!
