
From Mr. Trent Citrano, Head of School

Grade 1 Explore Occupations at Kandu

Grade 1 went on an exciting trip to Kandu in October. The children got to dress up and experience a wide variety of jobs. From police officers, hair stylists, Pokémon center workers and radio hosts the children had an exciting time trying out many different jobs. Maybe they got an idea about what they might want to be in the future!





Grade 2 Experience Get Up and Close with Airplanes

G2 went on a trip and had special access to the JAL Narita Airport Hangar, where they learnt about the preparations involved in getting an airplane ready for flight. They also had the exciting opportunity to observe flights taking off on the runway up close.











G3 Create Sundials to Explore the Sun and Shadows

In Grade 3 for their Science learning, the students have been looking at how the movement of the earth in relation to the sun, produces shadows. They investigated these shadows at different times of the day and discussed how they can use them to tell the time. The children had a lot of fun with this Science activity.

Grade 4 Harness Solar Power

In Science, the Grade 4s went outside to explore how solar panels worked. They investigated how much power the panels could generate at different angles. Students recorded their observations carefully and noticed that the panels produced the most energy when facing directly toward the sun. During our class discussion, we discovered that keeping a solar panel at a 45° angle is the best way to get the most energy throughout the day.

Grade 5 Investigate Plant Cells & Reproductive Structures


