This document is designed to give you an outline of what your child will be learning over the coming weeks.

We will do our utmost to help your child achieve these goals. Your child's class teacher and Japanese teacher would be very happy to discuss with you how best you can support your child with their learning and celebrate their achievements. WHAT YOUR CHILD NEEDS TO BRING

1) PE Kit

Your child will need their PE kit on non-swimming weeks and they will need swimming kit on swimming weeks. Please refer to the schedule that was sent home for the dates the children will be swimming in Term 3.

2) Lunch

A healthy packed lunch and chopsticks/cutlery for school lunch.

5) Homework

Homework is given out each Thursday and should be submitted on Seesaw by Tuesday morning. Children should read at home each night and discuss the story with an adult.
